Marie Curie Wales

We provide care and support for more than 3,500 people living with a terminal illness in Wales each year.

We have just over 140 Marie Curie Nurses working in communities across Wales, and they care for around 2,300 terminally ill people and their families in their homes each year.

We also have the Marie Curie Hospice, Cardiff and the Vale, in Penarth, which cares for around 1,200 people each year, including people staying in the hospice and those coming in for the day to use the hospice's services.

Whilst nursing is at the heart of everything we do, we do have other service across the country to support people in different ways.

Helper Service

Our Helper volunteers regularly visit terminally ill people in their home or talk on the phone, offering companionship and emotional support, as well as practical help. Helper volunteers are currently available in South Wales and we are expanding the service across Wales over the next few years.

Carers Project

We are working in partnership with local health boards, local authorities and voluntary organisations in Wales to deliver a series of workshops and information sessions we have developed specially for carers.

We aim to help carers who are looking after relatives or friends who are terminally ill. By supporting carers in this way, it is more likely that the people they are caring for will be able to remain in their preferred place of care – at home.

Support line

Launched in 2015, our support line offers support to anyone who has questions about a terminal illness. Our helpline officers are on hand to provide information on everything from day-to-day care, to sorting out money matters or coping with feelings or even just as someone to talk to.

Campaigning

We campaign on behalf of people living with a terminal illness and their families, to make sure they can access the high quality care they need when they need it most.

Funding

Our services across Wales cost just over £8million to run, of which we receive just under £3.5 million direct funding from the NHS, this means we need to raise around £4.5 million a year to fund our hospices and nursing care in Wales.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, our services are offered free of charge to people with any terminal illness.
