1.	<p>Welcome, apologies and Notes of Previous Meeting (RH)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ashley Bijster (AB), President of the BPA addressed the meeting and gave a brief overview of her Presidential year. AB is the first President under the new governance structure and as such is able to be an Ambassador for the profession and promote the sector to as wide an audience as possible. 3.	<p>Know Your Parking Rights: (breakout discussion)</p> <p>The meeting split into two groups to discuss the new KYPR website that had been launched at the House of Commons on 25th November. The following feedback was given:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> KYPR is too far down on the google search and the site doesn't appear to work on a mobile phone. There is no obvious link or promotion of KYPR on the BPA website There are some errors in document: Use of the word “offence” rather than contravention; waiting times on single and double lines is the same – but no time given for the single, just the double. Concern over whether the Adjudication services were consulted engaged Leaflet is too long and too technical perhaps better to be one sided A5 promotional document that points people to the website where all the info 	

	<p>should be.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who is the website aimed at – before the ticket issued or after. • Should be clearer what is meant by private parking and the public sector environment • Should be more on the private parking environment – suggest separate sections • Keep it simple • What are the success indicators of this project? • Could it be reproduced in other languages on the website • Local authorities and stakeholders could help to promote by putting the link on their websites. • What other things would members like to raise: Promote the 99% of people who park legally. Promote management of parking not revenue raised. Encourage consistency in practice across the country. More education about why there is a need to enforce 	
4.	<p>SAMSIG presentation on Life Care Planning - Chris Whapples (CW)</p> <p>CW gave a very informative presentation about the work of SAMSIG and especially the need to Life Care Plans for car parks. The presentation is included with the circulation of these notes and is also available on the BPA website.</p>	
5.	<p>CTT Presentation on the Future of the Industry – Terry New (TN)</p> <p>TN gave a fascinating presentation giving a glimpse of the coming together of technologies which would bring inevitable changes to the parking industry. Car manufacturers are committed to providing additional services to add value to their products and the changes in society brought about by Smartphones, Apps and electric vehicles has created some exciting new technologies that the parking sector will need to embrace increasingly going forwards. TN supported his presentation with two almost “futuristic” videos – although this is now not the future!</p>	
6.	<p>Insurance Claims for Personal Injury</p> <p>RH reported that the National Operators Group of the BPA is concerned at the increasing number of personal injury claims BPA members are receiving from individuals relating to accidents in their car parks and are looking into the possibility of setting up a database to share data about such claims. There is concern that some individuals may be claiming for personal injuries at multiple car parks and such a database would assist in sharing intelligence to try and identify serial claimants and potential fraudulent ones. NOG are trying to ascertain the level of such claims that already exist and whether such a database would be of widespread use?</p> <p>The meeting discussed this matter and reported back that they had not experienced an increase in personal injury claims and did not see the need for such a database. JH to report back to NOG.</p>	JH
